Focus on Water Quality

• Looking for project ideas focusing on water quality? Replace school toilets, faucets, dishwashers, etc. to low-flow, energy star devices. Install faucets with automatic shut-off. If toilets or faucets can't be replaced, add aerators to faucets and toilet dams to toilets.

Southern: The Minnesota New Country School team is educating elementary students in their community about energy with kits received from Xcel Energy. They are also collecting data at their school to determine how much waste they are producing. Once the data is collected and analyzed, the team will create an education program to impact and reduce their waste.

State & National Grants & Other Opportunities

• November 19, 2016 – January 1, 2017: *Water/Ways* Exhibit has officially made its way to the Audubon Center of the North Woods. *Water/Ways* is a traveling exhibition and community engagement

- **Deadline November 25, 2016**: Project Polar Bear challenges student groups across the globe to take action on climate change. With the guidance of an advisor, middle and high school groups compete for a grant by creating a plan for a project that will help reduce reliance on fossil fuels and engage their communities. The top three high-scoring teams receive a grant of \$1,000, \$750, and \$300, respectively, to continue their projects. More information available on their website.
- **Deadline December 8, 2016:** USDA Farm to School Grants are available to assist eligible entities in implementing farm to school programs that improve access to local foods in eligible schools. For application instructions and additional information, visit their <u>website</u>.
- **Deadline December 22, 2016**: The <u>Green Ribbon Schools Awards</u> from the U.S. Department of Education are available to all prek-12 schools, school districts, and post-secondary institutions. They honor schools that:
 - Reduce environmental impact by conservation of energy, water and waste
 - o Improve health and nutrition through gardens, food service and outdoor activities, and
 - Provide effective environmental education
