A Minnesota teaching license is not required for the Academic Challenge Coach category. State honorees will receive a crystal apple and an unrestricted \$15,000 gift at an awards brunch in the spring. Regional honorees will receive an unrestricted \$1,500 gift, trophy and the opportunity to compete in the state competition the following year.
