- <u>World Climate Simulation</u> uses C-ROADS and participants negotiate a global climate goal. Training offered Wed Nov 11 & 18 OR Fri Nov 13 & 20.
- <u>Climate Action Simulation</u> uses En-ROADS and participants choose energy solutions to reduce emissions. Training offered Wed Dec 2 & 9 OR Fri Dec 4 & 11.

Guidelines and Eligibility for Walmart Local Community Grants (\$250-\$5,000)

To complete what is possibly the shortest grant application you'll ever see:

- Click on this link and scroll to the bottom of the page
- In the drop-down menu, select "Community Grant Program"
- Click "Submit" to advance to the eligibility questions
- For Organization Name, use your school's name

Based on previous experience with applying for this grant, you might improve your chances by following up directly with the **Facility Manager** or **Grant Administrator** at your local Walmart. Inform them that your school submitted a Community Grant application and encourage them to review and approve your grant request. This is likely your ONLY chance to tell them about YES! because the application doesn't ask for details. For this grant, be sure to emphasize the <u>positive impacts YES! students and projects have on their community</u>!
